Music


Social-emotional - cooperation, taking turns, tapping to music Sensory motor - movement and imitation, tapping to music Cognitive - listening skills and memory, "Freeze" game Language - vocabulary, rhyming Activity - ABC song

Fine Motor Development


Sensory motor - hand strength, fine motor and bilateral coordination
Cognitive - estimating size and position
Language - identifying letters and sounds
Activities - dough, finger plays, building blocks, beads

Coloring


Observe the following skills as a child is coloring

 Activities - building, taking turns, drawing, counting


Developmental Stages of Drawing

Number and Capital Letter Formation

Capital letters first because they are easy



Lowercase letters are more difficult

Writing Name

Social-emotional - increasing self esteem Sensory motor - writing letters independently Cognitive - spelling skills

Language - reading and writing name

Alphabet Knowledge

Objects in a basket/box that begin with the same letter

Phonological Awareness

Syllables - clapping out 2, 3, 4, syllable words Rhyming words - books, matching magazine pictures

Oral Language

Practice following directions and learn new vocabulary Prepositions - top, bottom, middle, over, under Activity - Wooden sticks, puppets bring lessons to life

Numbers & Math

Counting

Rote counting One to one correspondence - setting table for snack Count classroom objects inside, counting leaves outside, counting body parts two eyes, one nose, 5 fingers

Shapes

Recognize and name shapes, stand on shapes, description of shapes by different attributes

Patterns

Use two, three objects Use vertical and horizontal patterns: ABAB, ABC ABC

Measurement

Use non-standard measurement for objects, such as bean bags
